In addition to representing the centre at multi agency meetings, working closely with colleagues in social care, health and within the cluster, you will also be responsible for devising and delivering bespoke packages of support with families. This will involve both targeted outreach within family homes, services offered through the centre and universal group sessions.

You will work directly with families to provide early intervention, developing the skills and knowledge of families within our community.

You will also be responsible for data input and analysis using SCMS and CPOMS.
